# REDCAR ATHLETIC FC CLUB HISTORY

Redcar Athletic FC formerly named Teesside Athletic FC were refounded in 1993 after the old organisation which was originally based in Middlesbrough folded with administration problems.

The club were indebted to the Local Authority for the use of their current base Green Lane, Redcar for a peppercorn rent. Initially the club had only junior members but with a progressive, ambitious committee the club made the decision to develop a dedicated grass roots football facility for everyone with exit routes into senior teams who would be encouraged to play at the highest level hence giving the exiting junior members the opportunity to participate in football at a decent level.

The club entered a Senior team into the Teesside League and shortly after in 2005 they were accepted into the Wearside League at the same time the club was successful in its application to the Football Foundation for funding in excess of £860,000 to develop their facility at Green Lane, this gave the club excellent facilities and in their first season in the Wearside League they finished an excellent fifth and won the Monkwearmouth Cup.

In 2010 the Club Committee made the brave decision to change the club name to Redcar Athletic Football Club the main objective to improve the clubs identity in Redcar.

In the thirteen years that we have been in the Wearside League we managed to accumulate numerous honours (see left).

For the past 5 years the club has been busy preparing the ground to ensure that it met the Step 6 Ground Grading criteria in readiness for promotion to the Northern League only to find in each season that the team did not attain the necessary League placing.

The Wearside League Championship was won on the last day of the 2017/18 season with a 7-0 home victory over Gateshead Leam Rangers gave the club promotion to the Northern League and our first ambition realised.

Season 2018/19 saw Redcar Athletic compete in the Northern League following promotion from the Wearside League. Redcar's 1st team in the Northern League for nearly 100 years an unbelievable and incredible statistic.

Our first season in the Northern League saw us finish an excellent 7th. Last season was the season that never was, a massive injustice for the efforts of everybody concerned in getting the club on the brink of promotion to Division One only to have the season declared null and void due to the Covid 19 crisis. We need to put that all behind us now and go again and I am sure we are in for a very exciting season.

# **CLUB HISTORY**

The current Sunderland West End is not the first team to bear the name. The first Sunderland West End played in the Wearside League and took part in the first League in season 1892-93. Sadly, they finished bottom winning one and drawing two out of eighteen.

They finished bottom again the following season and carried on until the 1930s with a best league finish of second.

Sunderland West End SC was a successful team from the 50s and 60s who played in the Wearside Combination League with great success.

The current Sunderland West End started out as Jolly Potter and the first game took place on Saturday 2nd September 2006 when they played Gala Casino and won by the impressive score line of 12-1. Team sheet for the day shows five players scoring two goals each and two not given to any player. One of the substitutes that day was Gary Gettins, the current vice-chairperson, who is one of a number of people who have been involved with the club from the beginning.

Also playing that day was David Keithley who is still turning out for the West End.

After that first day victory the team managed to finish runners up and gain promotion to the Premier Division. They also finished as runners up in the Aged Miners Trophy losing to the Dagmar in the final

The following season saw a mid table finish and going out early in the cups. Success was to follow the following season with a league and cup double. The Alan Hood Trophy came back to the Potters after a win over Hylton Colliery.

The league was sealed with a 6-0 win against Easington Lane WMC. Sadly, the team is not recorded for that day.

The league title was secured again in season 2009—2010 beating Redhouse into second place by seven points. A play off was needed the following year and Sunderland West End Potters as they were now called duly obliged by beating Sunderland Hendon 3-2.

First ever game in the Wearside League took place on Wednesday 10th August, 2011 and West End came out on top 3-2. Goal scorer that day was Joe Walton with a hat trick. Joe now plays for Morpeth Town in the Northern Premier League Premier Division.

After finishing fourth in that first season West End have gone on to finish eighth, ninth, eighth, third, tenth another third position and in 2018 – 2019 runners up and so gain promotion to the Northern League Second Division.

The club has also had a number of Cup successes with wins in the Monkwearmouth Charity Cup, the Shipowners Cup and the Durham Trophy.

# **ON THIS DAY**

#### **SEPTEMBER 16TH**

In 1937, the first live TV football match was broadcast for the game between Arsenal and Arsenal reserves.

The BBC begun their television service the year before, and with only a few thousand TVs in the country at the time, very few people were able to watch it.

The broadcast lasted just 15 minutes including an introduction of the team, however no record of the score remains.

This was not the first time the Gunners were involved in the testing of new technology, as ten years earlier the First Division fixture between Arsenal and Sheffield United became the first live football match broadcast on radio.

Arsenal continued their record of being tested for new ways of watching the sport, as they were the first team broadcast on Match of the Day in 1964 and the first team broadcast live in 3D in 2010.

#### **SEPTEMBER 17TH**

On September 17th 1974, Liverpool kicked off their Cup Winners' Cup campaign by pounding Norwegian club Strømsgodset by the score of 11-0. It remains Liverpool's greatest margin of victory, with nine separate players scoring goals.

It was the second Cup Winners' Cup appearance for Strømsgodset, who were eliminated in the first round in the 1970-71 competition. They fared no better in 1974, when they traveled to Anfield for the first leg of their first-round match-up with Liverpool.

The Reds wasted no time in establishing their dominance, going ahead in the third minute with a penalty kick by Alec Lindsay. Phil Boersma doubled the lead 10 minutes later and Liverpool went up 5-0 by halftime with a strike from Phil Thompson (30'). another from Boersma (40'), and one from Steve Heighway (42'). The second half was even worse for the Norwegians, as Peter Cormack (65') got on the scoresheet, followed by goals from Thompson (74'), Emlyn Hughes (76'), Tommy Smith (85'), lan Callaghan (87'), and Ray Kennedy (88').

The Reds were less prolific in the remainder of the tournament, winning the second leg 1-0, then dropping out of the competition on away goals after drawing 1-1 on aggregate with Ferencváros in the second

# THE FAMOUS YORKSHIREMEN:

# THE FORGOTTEN HISTORY OF REDCAR'S FOOTBALLING PIONEERS

# Ascendency. 1883/84

By 1883 Redcar and Coatham had only been around for five years, but they'd achieved a lot in half a decade. Competing in England's second-oldest surviving cup competition – the Sheffield Challenge Cup – as well as co-founding the Cleveland FA, meant that thousands of spectators were frequently coming to their games, especially their battles for supremacy of the North East against old foes Middlesbrough. William Harrison was undoubtedly their best player, not only winning games for Redcar but captaining Cleveland and representing Sheffield in games against the likes of London, Edinburgh, Glasgow and Lancashire. He also played in several North v South games at The Oval which acted as trial games for selecting England internationals.

Although Harrison was winding down his career by this point, he had one last thing on his checklist: competing in The FA Cup. And by the 1883/84 season, finally Redcar entered a team into the competition. Unluckily for them it was against Nottingham Forest, who would be semi-finalists the following season and would go on to win the competition just over a decade later. There's some conflicting reports about what exactly happened, as most newspapers simply stated that Redcar telegraphed on the Friday to say that they were unable to get a team together, which is a little short notice but never mind. The Athletic News reported, however, that Redcar wanted Forest to pay their expenses, and forfeited the match when they refused to do so. Whatever happened Redcar never played an FA Cup match in 1883. But William Harrison did. He was a regular fixture in the Sheffield representative side by this point, so when Sheffield Wednesday needed players, he joined old friends Mosforth, Wilkinson and Hudson for their FA Cup 3rd round tie against...Nottingham

Technically this was the season prior to Redcar's first entry to the cup, as it was in the later stages of the 1882/83 competition. Without some key players, Wednesday enlisted the help of Harrison alongside Pyebank's Betts as well as Bentley of Walkley for their third round tie against Forest. Harrison scored in the 2-2 draw, then scored twice and assisted the other in the 3-2 win in the replay. Talk about being the difference maker. His name actually also appeared in a Sporting Life article in February detailing a list of probable teams for the Fourth Round tie against Notts County (I promise the FA Cup wasn't just full of Nottingham sides), but owing to a complaint from Forest about the eligibility of the three Yorkshiremen, he did not feature. Wednesday lost that game, by the way.

From here on, although Harrison did still occasionally appear for Redcar, as well as the Cleveland and Sheffield representative sides, they were fewer and farther between. He was 31 at this point, and many match reports at this time mention him either coming down with some form of mystery illness or being injured, so unfortunately it seems as though Old Lady Time caught up with him by 1884. You better hold on tight, cos she bucks hard. He was also offered a job as an assistant school inspector in Kent, furthering his career in education that had originally brought him to Redcar. Professionalism in football was not legal until 1885, so there are many cases during this period where talented players suddenly stop playing in order to focus on their careers, no longer being able to justify the commitment of playing football all around the country alongside a full-time job and

Being down in Kent meant that he was available to be 'umpire' at a London Challenge Cup game between holders Upton Park (who won Gold at the 1900 Olympics representing Great Britain) and Tottenham Hotspur (who went on to "put pressure on Chelsea" in 2016/17). He still made the effort to travel for occasional appearances in some of the higher-profile matches in the North East, including Cleveland Challenge Cup and FA Cup matches for Redcar (more on that later) and one last appearance for Cleveland against Scarborough, where he would play alongside future Redcar Crusaders goalkeeper Dawkings.

Then came his last hurrah. As the schools closed for the Christmas period, William took the trek north to spend the festive period with his family. Unmarried with no children, his journey took him not to Redcar, but Sheffield, where his older brother Thomas was living.

In fact, he was living at the top of Abbeydale Road, not half a mile from Bramall Lane. And as fate would have it, his visit to Sheffield not only coincided with a Sheffield Wednesday game (who were the original tenants of Bramall Lane), but many of his old colleagues were unable to play the match against FA Cup holders Blackburn Rovers (a fixture that would be repeated only a couple of years later in the FA Cup Final in front of a crowd of 20,000). A very popular figure in South Yorkshire, the crowd were delighted to see that he had been convinced to don the famous blue and white stripes once again. But he was well and truly out of practice, and Blackburn, inspired by the likes of Fergus Suter, star of Netflix's The English Game, had already proved themselves as the best team in the country. Harrison was "rushing into football from the enervating toil of school inspectorship"1, wrote one newspaper, "though everyone was glad to see him on the field". Despite holding their own in a 1-1 draw, and some occasional dazzling runs that had made him a hit in Sheffield, it was not the perfect swansong. The Sheffield Daily Telegraph nicely sums up the high regard in which he was held, and the disappointment of his performance:

One pleasant feature was the reappearance on the field of Mr. Harrison, late of Redcar, who is on a visit to Sheffield, and he was prevailed upon to take his place among his old compatriots. Mr. Harrison, however, was evidently out of practice, and before he again leaves for the South we hope to see him when he was re-acquired his unrivalled dodging tactics and general good play.

Well, you're in luck, because this wasn't his swansong after all. Blackburn Olympic – FA Cup holders two years previous – had a return match against Sheffield Wednesday to play after spanking them 12-0 earlier in the season. Wednesday needed quality, and Harrison wouldn't disappoint this time. He notched up a superb assist in a 6-0 win over Olympic on Boxing Day, this being his last ever game in Sheffield. In fact, he sort of disappears altogether by this point, and there are no obituaries or death records for him, which is a source of great pain and frustration for me. The most logical reason would be that he emigrated, but I can't categorically tell you that he's not still alive now, despite the fact that he would be 162 in 2020.

Moving on from immortal club captains, and rewinding back to April 1884 to when Harrison was still making the odd appearance, by this point there had been three Cleveland Challenge Cup finals; Middlesbrough v Redcar in 1881, Middlesbrough v Redcar in 1882, and Middlesbrough v Redcar in 1883. Anyone else sensing a pattern? If you're not, please put this down and call a doctor immediately. With that in mind, if you could put your house on who the two teams in the 1884 final would be, what would you say? This isn't a trick question, it was Boro and Redcar again. This was to be the biggest meeting between the two yet, as almost 4000 people packed into the Redcar and Coatham Cricket Ground, and despite The York Herald noting a "hard struggle throughout for supremacy" 2,

Middlesbrough once again came away with the victory. Now might be a good time to say this: Boro went on to win the trophy – now known as the North Riding Senior Cup - five times in a row, and so far they have won it \*checks notes\* FIFTY-FIVE TIMES. No Redcar team has ever won it. Ouch.

But this season, Redcar had bigger fish to fry. That's a pun based on the fact that Redcar were sometimes referred to as The Fishermen, by the way. Sometimes they were called the Seasiders, and also Redcarites but I don't know how to feel about that last one. Anyway, this is a special year because in 1884/85, Redcar would actually play in the FA Cup. It's a big one, too, because Sunderland were coming to town. Although the young Redcar team started well and quickly went 3-0 up, Sunderland came back into the game in the second half and scored within five minutes of the restart, and "looked as if they would win" according to the Sunderland Daily Echo, which is a tad presumptuous since they were still losing by two goals in the second half, but never mind. Despite a second Sunderland goal being ruled out for offside. the score remained 3-1 and Redcar progressed to the next round.

But I believe something even more special happened in this game, because I believe that this match features the first ever recorded example of an overhead kick. Many South American countries lay claim to this honour, after the sport was imported via English seafarers on the docks. One of the more widely accepted claims is from 1914, courtesy of a Chilean named Ramon Unzaga. But, friends, that man William Harrison got there first. One of the most creative and skilful players in the country at the time, The York Herald reported that Redcar's second goal came about when "Harrison kicked the ball over his head", which was "loudly applauded" 3. The Sunderland Echo said the same, "a magnificent shot over his head, cheer after cheer greeting the feat." 4. That's more

than enough proof for me. Redcar: Home of the Overhead Kick. Put it on the sign.

Upwards of 3000 people descended upon Grimsby as they hosted Redcar in the next round, so say the Lincolnshire Chronicle. "Redcar beat Grimsby by three goals to one", reported The Field (The Country Gentlemen's Newspaper) <sup>5</sup>, which I'm sad to say is entirely wrong. The York Herald had a more accurate report, noting that Redcar scored the first goal, although Grimsby equalised before half time. With the wind at their backs, which was a huge deal back in those days, Grimsby had the ascendency in the second half and came away 3-1 winners. Not an ideal start for their first FA Cup campaign, but they did lose to a team who, upon their second FA Cup Semi Final appearance a few decades later, would set the record attendance an Old Trafford, which still stands today. Pretty cool.

But if you think that's the best that Redcar have ever done in the FA Cup then think again, my friend, because it got a lot better the following year. Redcar's young team had gained valuable experience in the FA Cup and Sheffield Challenge

Cup, and more players were going on to represent Cleveland in very competitive games up and down the country. In just seven short years' time, Sunderland would go on to reach their second FA Cup Semi Final in a row, and win the first of their Division One titles in a period that would see them win it three times in four years. But in 1884/85, Redcar would once again prove too much for them.






