Keep following the guidance



Last week the Football Association issued a statement concerning the need to follow social distancing guidance, in a bid to support the great work Leagues and Clubs have undertaken to keep football being played.

The agreement negotiated between The FA and the Department for Culture Media and Sport means that the game of football is not considered a "close contact" by the social distancing regulations, as long as Clubs continue to fully implement their risk assessments. A failure to implement these risk assessments is likely to result in matches being postponed and players and spectators self-isolating, in line with Test and Trace guidance.

As COVID restrictions nationally become tighter, the footballing authorities are becoming increasingly aware of instances where players and spectators are stretching or even ignoring the guidance. Whilst the Clubs and the Leagues do not have the power of enforcement, the Police do have the power to fine individuals for persistent breaches of the guidance. Local councils have also been given a suite of powers to close down premises, stop events and shut down parks if they are concerned about threats to public safety.

Following on from the FA announcement last week, the Toolstation Western League has issued specific guidance to its Clubs, urging players and managers to lead by example, supporting Club volunteers to ensure matches are COVID safe. In its statement to Clubs, the League has highlighted the importance of a number of measures, including:

- Extra seating in technical areas to ensure the occupants remain at a safe distance from each other and spectators.
- Teams must follow the advice of the home sides Risk Assessment and ensure only the maximum number of players and support staff enter the changing room at any given time.
- If players have to car share they should do so with the same individuals on each occasion. Where minibuses are used, everyone should wear a face mask and use hand cleanser before and after entry.
- Spectators must respect the rule of 6 and maintain social distancing at all times, inside and outside the clubhouse.

Western League matches rely on the support of unpaid matchday stewards, who now find themselves on the frontline of reminding spectators about their responsibilities. The Western League is urging all spectators and Club Officials to respect and support the difficult task these volunteers now face.

Western League COVID Officer, George McCaffery, said; "By not maintaining the guidelines and most importantly of all, the social distance, if there is a positive test within the club the risk of numerous people needing to self-isolate increases greatly.

If we want to keep playing we are all going to need to work together. If you see something you're not happy with on a matchday, please raise it with a Club Official."


Sadly, for us, Bolton won a totally forgettable match 3-1.....



FOOTBALL IN THE TIME OF COVID-19

From the pen (keyboard) of Antony Randle

(From The London Stadium to The Tannery - via Letchworth)



The topic of spectators is coming to the head of the agenda for the clubs in the top four leagues; with the government warning of possible postponement of the experiment of allowing reduced numbers into stadia from October, the EFL and Premier League have responded saying that it should 'remain committed' to its original intention. It looks to me as if the situation is on a knife-edge given the ongoing increase in reported cases of infection and tightening of restrictions in many areas. With the Premier League elite still largely insulated because of the TV money, it's the clubs in the EFL that are beginning seriously to feel the pinch and who are saying



that without being permitted to admit even limited numbers of fans they face dire financial consequences. And this comes in the same week as Macclesfield have been wound up and the administrators of Wigan have expressed fears about not being able to find a buyer for the club. OK, both of those clubs got into trouble pre-Covid but the current situation is hardly conducive to attracting investors where a whole raft of others are teetering on the brink of following the unfortunate duo into oblivion.

And yet....as someone pointed out the debt which has brought Macclesfield down - £500k owed to HMRC, a serious amount of money for a club at that level - is £100k less than the weekly wage Gareth Bale will continue to receive as part of the loan deal bringing him back to Spurs. If you wanted a glaring (not to say unpleasantly-bad-taste-in-the-mouth) example of the shocking disparity between life at the top of football and the struggle at the bottom, there it is in spades. Now whilst I'm not suggesting that a player who's sat on his arse for a year or so doing bugger-all but pick up his ginormous wedge (rather than exercise his undoubted talent somewhere else for a teeny bit less) should forego one week's pay to save a club with whom he's never had any connection, it was interesting to read a report that Victor Moses (who got his start in The Big Time with Wigan) had considered the possibility of doing something to help prevent his former club sliding into the abyss. So perhaps all top footballers aren't exactly unaware of how difficult life is lower down the

scale but you can't blame the public for holding a general perception of them as ludicrously overpaid ivory-tower-dwellers. Oh for more Marcus Rashfords.....

Having seen how all the Covid-secure compliance routines operate at our level (both at The Tannery and at Bridport and Odd Down), and accepting that the smaller the numbers, the easier they are to put into practice, I have a huge amount of sympathy with the EFL clubs, in particular those in Leagues 1 & 2. On the basis that their stadia are rarely filled to capacity anyway they should be easily adaptable to the requisite social-distancing provisions; I guess it's more the entry and exit routines that might cause problems but even those shouldn't be insurmountable. With the Premier League clubs, however, particularly those in the bigger cities, dealing with the public transport arrangements only adds to the concerns surrounding the movement and gathering of (relatively) large numbers of people. I'm glad I'm not the person who has to make the final decision about this, it's almost a no-win situation; on the one hand risk a significant

increase in the number of infections, on the other see a significant number of football clubs go to the wall.

I can only hope that whatever decision is finally made the status quo remains as far as clubs at our level are concerned. Without, I hope, getting too carried away by The Cobblers' encouraging start to the season, what I've seen so far has got me thinking we could be in for something special for the remainder. The players look full of energy after the long lay-off and the spirit in the side seems strong; I know that in bigging them up like this I could be putting the commentator's curse on them tonight (where this is also being written prior to the trip to Newguay in the FA Vase, fingers crossed with a home tie in the next round in prospect....) but I'm hoping that whatever the result this exciting young team will be able to continue providing such welcome respite from the increasingly gloomy news forecasts. I can also hope that more people will want to avail themselves of the uplift watching Street FC lately has given me.....

Exmouth Town Football Club was formed in 1933, playing their home games on the Maer Cricket Field. They moved to their current home at Southern Road in 1964

After many successful seasons in the Devon and Exeter League they joined the Western League in 1973. They were promoted to the Premier Division after finishing Runner-Up of Division One in 1981/82 and won the Premier Division in 1983/84 and again in 1985/86. Other Western League honours include League Cup winners 1989/90, Premier Division Runner-Up (twice) and the Sportsman Trophy (twice).

Cup success includes winning the Devon St Lukes Bowl (three times), Devon Senior Cup, Devon Premier Cup (twice) and in 1984/85 they reached the Semi-Final of the FA Vase, narrowly losing to Fleetwood Town by the odd goal over the two games. During this period the Club installed floodlights and hosted many matches against Football League sides. On the 28 July 1987 they recorded their highest home attendance of 2,395 for a match against Liverpool.

The success of the eighties was unfortunately not repeated during the nineties and the Club was relegated after the 1993/94 season. They gained promotion back to the Premier Division for the 2003/04 season but regrettably had to withdraw from the Western League during 2005.

On the 1st August 2006 the Club reformed as Exmouth Town (2006) AFC, playing in the Devon and Exeter League. At the end of the season they were promoted into Division One

(East) of the newly formed South West Peninsula League, a step seven league in the national pyramid system. The Club won the East Division in the 2012/13 season losing only one league game. They also won the Devon Premier Cup and reached the semifinal of the SWP League Cup. Having achieved promotion to the Premier Division the side finished as runners-up in season 2013/14.

Having consolidated their position as a Premier Division side they finished eighth in season 2014/15 and twelfth in 2015/16. Season 2016/17 saw further improvement when they not only finished fifth in the League but also reached the final of the League cup, the final of the St Lukes Bowl and the last sixteen of the FA Vase.

The 2019/20 season brought highlights in the FA Cup with victories over Southern League sides Barnstaple and Yate Town. When the season was brought to a premature end due to the coronavirus pandemic Town were well placed in fifth position having extended their unbeaten home record dating back to December 2018.
