

## COVID-19 POSTPONEMENT UPDATE



The Toolstation Western League would like to clarify their position regarding the pandemic and how we can continue to safely play football. This procedure is followed for all cases and the club's Risk Assessment should reflect this.

Clubs will contact the TWL COVID Officer when someone at the Club has symptoms and has or will take an NHS Test, the person must immediately self-isolate. The TWL will require a copy of the test result, either positive or negative.

Whilst waiting for the outcome of the test, the TWL will enquire as to what COVID protocols have been followed, during and after the last game. The decision on whether the club continues playing is dependent on the risks identified during the enquiry and the TWL COVID Officers decision must be adhered to.

If protocols have been followed on match day and on training nights, then the club and their previous opponents are normally allowed to continue with their fixtures, even if the one person's test is eventually positive.

If protocols have not been followed, the TWL will review each situation with the consideration of postponing their next game whilst waiting for the result, to reduce potential risk to other clubs. The subject club will be required to start self-isolation of members at risk, from the date when the symptoms were identified. This is a legal requirement subject to £1000 fine for failing to do so.

If the test is negative the club continues with their League programme. Anyone who has begun self-isolating may stop although they should increase their awareness of symptoms and increase their cleansing routines.

If the test is positive then the person must isolate for 10 days from the date of symptoms. The NHS Test and Trace will be contacted and they will make decisions regarding self-isolation for potential contacts dependant on the information they are given. The NHS will then text the contacts informing them to self-isolate, but this may take more than 2 or 3 days.

Some clubs increase the safety of their members by pre-empting the NHS T&T and decide to inform their members, who are identified as potential contacts, to continue their self-isolation; as they are aware that there is an increased risk, due to protocols not being followed.

The TWL will then postpone the fixtures for those 14 days.

If you are self-isolating as a result of contact with someone who has tested positive then you must complete the 14 days self-isolation. If you decide to have a test during this period and it is negative, you are still required to complete the 14 days self-isolation.

Hopefully, by following the protocols, you will be spared the necessity of self-isolation and the problems that brings as a result. So please stay healthy and fit.

#### COVID-19 FAQ's

#### What happens if a player tests positive for Covid-19?

If there is a player who has tested positive, **they must from that point self-isolate** (or if they have symptoms, from the moment of symptoms) and NHS Test and Trace will pick up from this point. **The player should contact NHS 111**.

NHS Test and Trace will send a text, email alert or call with instructions of how to share details of people with whom there has been close, recent contact and places visited. It is important that the player responds quickly and accurately so that the NHS can give appropriate advice to those who need it.

The Club can carry on, but be mindful to ensure all the guidelines are strictly followed on social distancing, hand washing etc. If Test and Trace contact them, they must provide the details and then if deemed necessary, anyone needs to isolate on their instruction, do so.

Matchplay is not considered 'close contact' so no action is needed unless individuals

What happens if I have played an opposition team and one of their players has tested

experience symptoms or have not followed match day protocols, **in which case they must self-isolate from that point** as per Government guidance.

#### What is self-isolation?

'Self-isolation if you have symptoms' means that you and all household members must remain at home. Do not go outside your home for any reason - that is to work, school or public areas and do not use public transport or taxis.

If told to begin self-isolation for 14 days from your last contact with the person who has the symptoms or tested positive, it is really important to do this even if you don't feel unwell because, if you have been infected, you could become infectious to others at any point up to 14 days. Failure to self-isolate for the full time-period can result in a fine, starting from £1,000.

Your household doesn't need to self-isolate with you if you do not have symptoms, but they must take extra care to follow the guidance on social distancing and hand washing and avoid contact with you at home

#### What is contact?

'Contact' means a person who has been in close contact with someone who has tested positive for coronavirus and who may or may not live with them. In the TWL this would be a teammate if you have not followed the match day or training session protocols.

The club was founded in 1898 initially playing close to the Rhinefield Ornamental Drive. The Badgers were founder members of the New Forest league which they won a number of times. They moved before the first World War to a site between the Rose and Crown and Snakecatcher pubs.

Following the war the club played in both the Bournemouth and

Hampshire leagues, moving to Fathersfield. In 1931 they were forced to move again to Black Knoll when Fathersfield was given over to housing. In 1935 the club won the New Forest Lads Cup. Within two years the Badgers moved to Oberfield and after the Second World war they spent some seasons at Tile Barn before moving to their current home at Grigg Lane in 1951.

The club were crowned Hampshire League Division Three champions in 1960 as well as winning the Bournemouth Seniors cup. They moved between the Second and Third divisions until in 1971 they were promoted to Division One where they won the league title in the 1975-76 season. Brockenhurst were founder members of the Wessex League joining in 1986. The club's FA Cup giant killing reached its pinnacle in season 2001/02 when Kingstonian were defeated and in season 2004/05 the club reached the 3rd qualifying round, the run ending in defeat to Bath City.

In season 2012/13 the club returned to the Wessex Premier League as Division One champions and reached the final of both the Southampton DFA Senior Cup and the Wessex league Cup though unfortunately were beaten in both. The club has been rebuilding under the leadership of Manager Pat McManus with the target of reaching the top half of the league in the coming season and developing the squad with a view to building further on the initial success.

2016/17 saw the introduction of two new teams with a focus on attracting the best young players in the area. The U18's team finished second, on goal difference, in their first season in Hampshire Youth Football League (Div 2) and gained promotion to division 1 for the 17/18 season. The U18's also entered the prestigious FA Youth Cup in 17/18, the first time in the clubs history. The Development Squad play in The Wyvern Combination League (West) and are a stepping stone between the U18's and first team.

Both teams have proven invaluable to the first team since their inception.



2017/18 Won the Les Phillips Cup despite having to play numerous games on consecutive days at the end of the season due to bad weather



is going into a two-week 'circuit-breaker' and God knows what's happening to grassroots football in those areas subject to Tier 2 or 3 restrictions. The clouds are gathering and it may well not be very long before the turnstile at The Tannery will have to be locked again despite our fervent hopes to the contrary. I imagine the poor Fixtures Secretary at The Western League must be having sleepless nights at the moment thinking of the increasing number of postponed matches he's finding himself obliged to rearrange.

In these dark times we have to find our comforts where we can and fortunately football can be one such source though I'm the first to acknowledge it sometimes seems as if the lows outweigh the highs, unless of course you happen to support one of those teams (e.g. Liverpool or Plymouth Parkway in our league at the moment) for whom winning much more often than not is an expectation rather than an aspiration.

Throughout my fifty-six years of active football-fandom I've never been in that largely carefree position except perhaps during each of West Ham's fortunately brief periods in the second tier following their five relegations over that period.

With apologies to our esteemed Hon. Life President (a Gooner who complains that this column is too Hammers-centric) I have to record that last Sunday's game at Spurs provided one of those all-too-rare instances - one of those truly golden moments when you forget all the disappointments and hurts and just wallow in the beauty of fate shining its light on your team's fortunes instead of typically pissing all over your chips. I'm talking of course of Manuel Lanzini's stunning 94th-minute, last-kick-ofthe-game equalising strike from outside the box into the top right-hand corner of Hugo Lloris' net to seal The Hammers' battling come-back from being 3-0 down after sixteen minutes, all three of their counters coming in a glorious, adrenaline-soaked last twelve minutes.

As I scraped myself off the ceiling I was doubly relieved to hear the whistle blow for fulltime, remembering all too sharply how The Cobblers had similarly battled back from a half-time 0-3 deficit against Exmouth at the beginning of this year only to concede the winner at the death, an illustration if ever one was needed just how cruel fate can be in football.

Yet despite such soul-destroying setbacks we hardened fans of teams in the chasing pack rather than the front-runners keep coming back, keep hoping that this Saturday the winds will be in our favour, our team will sail to victory and we can look forward to truly enjoying that post-match pint. I've often wondered how it must feel for those who support the perennial winners, whether or not they get jaded by the tedium of routinely swatting aside the cannon-fodder.

I think of my three Manchester Unitedsupporting nephews, all of whom were born in the years after Fergie's Red Machine started hoovering up trophies by the bucketful so knew only the relentless march to victory. I see them now, in the eighth relatively fallow season since his retirement, and they seem bewildered by the fact that their club is no longer the force it was, no longer feared by its opponents and I can't resist teasing them by saying that at last they're experiencing the reality of 99% of football fans, that life isn't an endless bowl of cherries but more often some pretty thin gruel leavened occasionally by the sort of tasty morsel served up by Manuel Lanzini last Sunday.

And yet....as someone has ruefully pointed out, all those three West Ham goals were scored at what would have been the away end at White Hart Lane where he was imagining the riotously bonkers celebrations that would have greeted that exquisitely-struck equaliser, the triumphantly-bellowed 'Oo Are Ya!' chants that would have been hurled at the shell-shocked Spurs fans.

Yes, my joy in watching it on tv was probably as unconfined but it's just not the same as being there. I constantly remind myself how lucky I am still to be able to watch The Cobblers in person, to still be physically present in savouring the uncertainty of knowing whether or not it's going to be our day, if we're going to upset the odds or get the result that form and league placing dictates.

It's been a great ride these past couple of months, let's just keep hoping it continues.

Back to winning ways in the Western League after the previous week's reverse at the hands of Bitton, this was one of The Cobblers' strongest displays of the season, a similar margin of victory in recording the double against the team from Bath following on from last month's 4-1 success at their ground *writes Antony Randle*.

In truth, however, it could and should have been more than double the three goals actually scored, skipper Kam Andrews alone passing up a prospective hat-trick in failing to put away three gilt-edged chances that he would have slotted without batting an eyelid last season.

In his defence it should be pointed out that he's still on the road back from injury; missed opportunities to score apart there were plenty of positives in his performance, signs that he's getting back to his old forceful self particularly in winning the freekick for the second goal in being brought down on the edge of the box after driving past the defender who escaped with only a yellow card when a red was what he deserved as last man.

That came right on the stroke of half-time with Leighton Thomas taking the kick and directing the ball past both the wall and the stationary keeper, a fitting conclusion to a first period in which the home side had taken the lead in the 33rd minute, Andrews cutting the ball back from near the goal line on the right to Jakob Dickens for a measured side-footed finish.



The new centre-back pairing of Henry Lawrence-Napier (also playing his way back from injury) and Paddy Willis (slotting into an unaccustomed role in the absence of three other contenders for that position and carrying it off admirably) kept the Odd Down strikers at bay leaving Liam Norris little to do but catch a few crosses.

Man-of-the Match Kyle Strange was as busy as ever up front; he must be the most fouled player in the league, happily coming unscathed through one particularly brutal 'tackle' later in the second half which was deemed worthy of a yellow card for the offender when again the ref clearly had the option of applying the stronger sanction.

With Thomas adding his second goal and The Cobbs' third a couple of minutes after the restart the game was effectively over as a contest though interest was maintained as they spurned one chance after another to put a bigger gloss on the scoreline.

There are some tougher-looking fixtures to come in the next couple of weeks but there's also plenty of scope for optimism that The Cobbs can maintain their good form and high placing in the table with the return of key players bolstering the strength of the squad available to Nik Andrews.

It took a 22nd-minute penalty to win a scrappy, undistinguished contest which saw the end of Street's run of having scored in every game since the start of the season writes Antony Randle.

If there was one factor which could be said to have contributed to the untidy nature of the play on both sides it was the state of the pitch, the lumpy uneven surface causing the ball constantly to bobble making a repeat of some of the flowing football from The Cobblers' win over Odd Down a few days before all but impossible.

However another feature of that match did reappear, one they could have done without, namely the passing-up of some early chances which, if taken, would have produced a very different outcome. Toby Davey really should have scored when teed-up by Kyle Strange but hit a tame shot straight at the defender covering the goal-line and a couple of other decent opportunities went begging in a frantic first twenty minutes in which Bradford also could and should have opened their account when their striker dithered too long after charging down Liam Norris' attempted clearance outside his penalty area.

Then came the penalty; in challenging as the winger performed his trademark stepover in bursting into the box Jakob Dickens went to ground a fraction too early and brought him down giving the referee an easy decision.

The spot-kick was slammed emphatically into the roof of the net and from then it seemed as if The Cobblers never found their rhythm, passes falling short or going long, flick-ons not reaching their targets, the bounce never quite going their way as they struggled to break down a committed Bradford defence.

For their part the home side appeared content to sit deep and let Street have the majority of possession, occasionally breaking out but never really threatening to add to their solitary goal.

The second half followed much the same pattern, neither side carving out any clear-cut chances with Street in particular failing to take any advantage from a series of free-kicks mostly given for fouls on Kyle Strange who tirelessly ran the Bradford back-line ragged all afternoon but was starved of goalscoring opportunities.

Perhaps Street's best chance of taking something from the game fell to sub Sandro Costanza from Leigh Bailey's headed flick-on at a free-kick but in stretching for the ball under pressure he couldn't direct his touch goalwards and it rolled a couple of feet wide.

All in all a disappointing afternoon at a ground where last year The Cobblers performed a classic smash-and-grab in winning 3-2; then they should have lost where this time they will have felt that this was one that got away, a game they didn't deserve to lose but one that perhaps they didn't really do enough to win either.




