#### A brief history of senior football in Bridgwater

#### BACKGROUND.

Early attempts to establish a senior association football club in the rugby stronghold of Bridgwater failed to attract supporters, were beset with financial woes and were thus short-lived.

It was not until after the Second World War that solid foundations for a club were finally laid. A group of enthusiasts formed Crown Dynamo FC in 1946 based at a public house in St John Street. The team quickly gained a substantial following and became the forerunner of Bridgwater Town AFC.

The purchase of land off Bristol Road for a home ground. the backing of a large supporters' organisation and the support of prominent local businessmen, who became directors enabled the club to flourish.

Soon the club owned a portfolio of residential property and was able to offer a house, a job and a good parttime wage to prospective footballers. This enabled the club to attract many ex-Football League professionals and field strong, competitive teams, which enjoyed great success as one of the Western League's leading sides.

Two Western League championship mantles, cup final wins and thrilling runs in the FA Cup and FA Trophy were experienced throughout the 1960's, 70's and 80's.

In 1982 Bridgwater Town became members Southern League. It all came to an abrupt end in June 1984 when substantial debts forced to club into voluntary liquidation.

#### THE CURRENT CLUB.

A new club, Bridgwater Town (1984) FC was quickly established by a band of loyal supporters and from humble beginnings worked all the way back up from Somerset County League origins to attaining Southern League membership inside a twenty-three year timespan.

On the way the club enjoyed a hat trick of Somerset County Premier titles, a Screwfix Western League Division 1 championship and two Les Philips Cup Final wins. As members of the Southern League they reached the Final of the Southern League Cup (2009) and were beaten finalists in the promotion play-offs (2010)

However after 2010 leaner times returned, eventually leading to relegation in 2017.

Now, again playing Step 5 level, the club remains ambitious and after a short period of consolidation, aims to compete strongly for the title and regain its previous status.

#### **BRIDGWATER TOWN FC**

**SEASON 2020/21** 

<u>Dave Pearse</u>: Hugely experienced, Dave returned to Bridgwater Town as joint player-manager with Karl Baggaley in season 2017/18 and will be looking to build on the progress made in recent years.

<u>Jake Viney</u>: Fantastic shot stopper and sweeper keeper. After suffering a serious injury which kept him out for a whole season in 2016/17, he has come back stronger than ever with a string of outstanding performances.

Reece Bannister: Reece is a promising young goalkeeper who has a great future ahead of him. Impressed pre-season and has been rewarded with being in the 1st team squad.

Mark Armstrong: Captain of the club and a born leader, Mark is an experienced, hardworking, tough tackling midfielder, equally comfortable in central defence.

Ryan Brereton: Ryan is an exciting and dynamic midfielder with a great left foot who will be looking to make a big impression in his first season with the club.

Conor Bryant: Conor joins for 2020/21 looking to build on experience gained at Buckland Athletic and Wellington. Good in the air and an excellent target man who will create numerous chances for others and expect to get amongst the goals himself.

James Cottrill: James is a promising midfielder who has earned promotion to the squad after a series of excellent performances for our U18s.

Sam Crumb: Striker Sam joined from Cadbury Heath having spent last season with TWL Div 1 Longwell Green Sports, where he scored 11 goals in 27 games.

Mike Duffy: Mike, returns to the club for the 2020/21 season and will be looking to establish his place in the starting line-up with high energy, combative performances.

Tom Ellis: In his third season with the club, a 'no nonsense' defender, Tom was captain of the Wellington side that won the TWL Division One title in 2016/17. His height makes him a real threat from set pieces. His long throws are legendary.

Tom Fry: Tom Is a talented midfielder from Newport, Gwent. He spent 11 years at Bristol City before playing in the Scottish League for Airdrie and Motherwell. More recently he has played for Barry Town in the Welsh Premier League and Hednesford Town in the Northern Premier League.

Tyne Govier: Long serving defender (since 2003/04) who returns to the club after a year spent travelling.

Jordan Greenwood: Jordan is a widely experienced, 'body on the line' defender who is equally comfortable as central defender or on the left flank.

Adnan Hiroli: Adnan is a very experienced attacker who was a key member of the Odd Down side that won the Western League title in 2015/16. He brings a winning mentality to the squad and will add goals and goal scoring chances to the team.

Jake Horsey: A talented defender who re-joined the club this season on dual-registration with Somerset County League side Middlezoy Rovers.

Marcus Jones: Joined the club in October 2020, Marcus is a striker or midfielder who recently played in the Welsh Premier League with Barry Town.

Ben Kirk: Vastly experienced midfielder who returns to the club after some time away. He was a key member of the BTFC squad that reached the Southern League Division 1 S&W play-off final in 2009/10. Previous clubs include Chippenham Town, Taunton Town and Weston super Mare.

Jake Llewellyn: Top quality defender who has played at National League South Level for Weston Super Mare; great going forward with a wand of a left foot.

Chris McGrath: Chris returns to Fairfax Park following stints at Buckland Athletic and Helston Athletic last season. A towering central defender, he has also been on the books of Taunton Town, Bideford, Bridport, Tiverton Town and Frome Town.

Ollie Morris: Versatile and energetic midfielder who returned to the club last season after spells with Street, where he was part of the squad that won the Western League title, and Larkhall Athletic.

George Painter: George re-joins the club after a season out with injury. Made a great impression when joining the squad part way through 2018/19 and will be looking to replicate those top class performances in the new campaign.

Archie Sturdy: An exciting, talented striker recently released by Yeovil Town. Joins on dual-registration with Taunton Town.

Recent signings Sam Crumb and Tom Fry took centre stage as Town eventually overpowered and outplayed the division's bottom club writes Mark Hollidge.

Crumb crowned his impressive debut with the two goals that put Town in charge and Fry's home debut was utterly scintillating. He was integral and instrumental in almost all the best parts of Town's display.

Town won at a canter in the end but the first half hour was even. Town lofted several high balls towards their new target man and Crumb showed that he knew how to win the ball in the air. However, the visitors showed that they could move the ball around and a fierce shot on the run from Josh Combe only cleared the bar by a foot.

Town had the ball in the net after 11 minutes when Tom Ellis headed in a Fry free kick but the whistle had blown for a foul.

Archie Sturdy and Conor Bryant both had shots which went wide before the visitors were reduced to 10 men. Will Davidson had a hack at Bryant and was sent off for a second yellow card.

Within a minute Town had made their numerical superiority count. Towler was sent clear in oceans of space. His first shot was parried by the deserving Langley but his second shot was placed wide of him.

Jake Viney, not having much to do, fancied joining in the fun and his wind assisted clearance had to be pushed over the bar by the back pedalling Langley. But Town's keeper was soon feeling relieved when a deflected shot by Josh Pandolfino struck the outside of the post.



The two sides have only met in the FA Vase on one occasion before today. This was back in September 1999 and 'Town were 4-1 victors on the day.

Since our club was reformed the matches have gone strongly in our favour, with fifteen wins as opposed to Welton's six. However, in May 2010 when the two sides met in the Final of the Somerset Premier Cup, played a Yeovil Town FC's Huish Park, our opponents today completed a huge giant killing act when they defeated our then highflying Southern League team in a penalty shootout after the match had finished 0-0 at the end of extra time. Welton's hero that day was their goalkeeper, Tristan Westlake, who saved penalties taken by Ben Kirk and Jak Martin. Admittedly, Bridgwater had had a gruelling end to the season and were leg weary and fielding a patched up side but it was still a shock result.

#### WELTON ROVERS FOOTBALL CLUB HISTORY



Founded as Welton Red Star, in the coal mining town of Midsomer Norton, in 1887, Welton Rovers are five time winners of the Western League and its longest serving members. Rovers' relationship with the Western League began in the 1903/04 season. The club's first few decades saw them triumph in multiple Somerset Senior Cups, and win their first Western League title in 1912, but a failed attempt at professionalism would eventually see the club go bankrupt and unable to compete in the 1923/24 season.

This blip is the only break in Welton's membership of the Western League from 1903 to the modernday, the club holding the dubious honour of having never been relegated - or promoted - outside of the two division set-up. In the years following World War Two, Welton Rovers FC built the most successful Amateur side in the area with four consecutive Amateur Cup victories, and in Brian Barker, Keith Simmons and Eddie Attwood, the best forward line for miles around.

Rovers' golden period came in the mid-1960s following the appointment, in 1963, of the club's first official manager, former Huddersfield Town and Bristol City striker Arnold Rodgers, and the return to professionalism. Welton became only the second club to win the Western League 3 times in a row - after Portsmouth FC - at the turn of the century, with wins in '65, '66 (undefeated!) & '67.

Potent throughout the time was the club's record goalscorer, Ian Henderson, who scored 321 goals in his spells with Welton. Rovers' triumphs brought with them an inflated reputation and showpiece matches, with the club's best ever FA Cup performance seeing them face AFC Bournemouth (then known as Bournemouth & Boscombe Athletic) in 1966 as well as exotic away days for end of season matches against a Guernsey XI in 1965 and to the Costa Brava the following year.

As is often the case, Welton's successes brought excesses and financial problems, and following the departure of Rodgers and 10 of his first-team squad, to Bath City, a period of uncertainty and mediocrity followed. That was until Dave Stone took the managerial reigns in 1971 and led Welton to their fourth, and most recent, league title in the 73/74 season.

Other showcases of the early '70s would see Juventus and Leeds United legend John Charles play and score at West Clewes for Merthyr Tydfil in the FA Trophy, and a Rothmans Cup final against now League 1 side Wycombe Wanderers. The tail end of the 20th century saw Welton trade promotions and relegations, creating many a club legend along the way. Managers such as Geoff Elliott and Steve Coles brought good times, while legendary players like Malcolm Beck and Graham Withey commanded transfer fees to move on to Football League clubs. The 1980s saw huge improvements to facilities with the expansion of the club house - which remains one of the best in the league to this day - and the installation of floodlights in 1988, the erection of which were celebrated with a friendly against Oxford United, then managed by Mark Lawrenson.

The 1990s started with possibly the club's most ridiculous season, finishing rock bottom of the Premier Division and getting through 3 managers. The third of which, Peter De Sisto, brought former Football League players Alan Biley and Gary Stanley to the club, but could only win 3 games all season. As bad as the decade began, it ended on a high with Rovers' locally assembled side winning promotion back to the Premier Division, under the tutelage of Adie Britton.

The past two decades have brought plenty of good times for Rovers' large and vociferous support, known as the Green Army. In 2006, Chris Mountford led Welton to their most successful season since the 1970s, with a 4th place Premier Division finish and Les Phillips Cup Semi-Final. Then, under Mark Harrington in 2010, Rovers won the Somerset Premier Cup for the first time, at Huish Park. A semi-final victory vs. Yeovil Town landed Rovers a final with Bridgwater Town, who they defeated on penalties to claim the silverware.

That side contained Nick Beaverstock, the man who would lead the Greens to their next taste of glory - as manager - when they won promotion to the Western League Premier Division in 2015. Beaverstock would go on to become the Rovers manager to take charge of the second highest number of matches, totalling 223 after a caretaker spell last season.

The club began the 2019/20 season with Jared Greenhalgh at the helm, but this did not bring the anticipated results, and shortly after Christmas the manager and club parted ways. After a rigorous application process, Tom Smith and assistant Will Justin took the helm, but before they could make their mark, Coronavirus caused the curtailment of the season. The Summer of 2020 has seen huge efforts to bring together a strong and exciting squad to push Rovers forward into the 2020s.

# **BILL DEPLIDGE**



In 1946 he rejoined the club and went on to give nine years of service to the then prominent Second Division club.



In his heyday he formed a right wing partnership with the legendary, Len Shackleton but whereas Len was allowed to move to First Division Newcastle United - and then on to Sunderland - the Park Avenue directors refused to entertain any bids that came in for Bill and his chance in the top flight was denied.

In total he made 274 starts for Bradford, scoring on 62 occasions.

In 1955 he moved to join Yeovil Town and in 1956 followed his former Bradford and Yeovil teammate, Scottish international Jimmy Stephen to Bridgwater Town. He was 31.

Bill made 183 appearances for Bridgwater and got on the score sheet 21 times.

Bill made a very successful conversion to halfback and went on to be the cornerstone of the Robins defence for six seasons. Bill's mobility, high level of fitness and ability to read the game enabled him to be a superb and consistent performer.

He was quite brilliant in the FA Cup campaigns of 1960 and 1961 that ended in ties against Oxford United and Crystal Palace and he must be ranked amongst the all-time greats performers in Bridgwater Town colours.

He eventually departed for Taunton Town in 1962 after being unable to agree terms.

- 13. Fail to control and take responsibility for the behaviour of minors attending with them.







Bridgwater were almost back to their best in this match played at Welton's West Clewes ground after a poor showing against Brislington on the previous Saturday.

The Town team dominated the first 45 minutes and played the ball around with style and confidence. However, the neat approach work failed to bring goals and Welton's goal scoring machine, Aaron Blakemore always looked a threat on the break. The referee denied Bridgwater what appeared to be two clear-cut calls for a penalty and the teams went in all square at the interval.

Torrential rain fell just before the break and soon large puddles were in evidence all over the pitch. The second half began with Bridgwater still on top but in the worsening conditions, unable to find their scoring touch. It was against the run of play that Welton took the lead. A corner from the right caused panic in the Town defence and Pete Shepherd poked home in the resulting goalmouth scramble.

Bridgwater forced a deserved equaliser in the 75th minute when Rob Snook's 25 yard free kick squirmed under the body of the diving Welton goalkeeper. And a minute later a cross from Dave Whalley stuck in a puddle and Chris Young reacted fastest to poke the ball past the wrong-footed defenders.

Matt Shaxton made victory safe in the dying seconds when he sprinted on to a through ball, rounded Allward in the Welton goal and put the ball into the empty net.
